Peer Tutoring Release Form

Peer Tutoring is an elective course designed to provide Seniors an opportunity to share their academic gifts with peers who find challenge in various academic areas. Students who are selected to become Peer Tutors are expected to display skills and attitudes that are positive in nature. Peer tutors receive a full 0.5 credit for the semester with a letter grade. Grades will be taken for participation and other activities at the discretion of the cooperating teacher.

Please read the following criteria and sign if you give permission for your student to participate:

1. The student must be in good academic and behavioral standing. In addition, attendance is an essential piece of this class, so you must be in good standing with our high school and district attendance policy.
2. The students must keep an open mind and positive attitude when working with students. In addition, CONFIDENTIALITY is a crucial piece of being an effective peer tutor/mentor. A confidentiality training is required and an assigned agreement will be signed prior to beginning your peer tutoring placement
3. Students are required to stay the **entire duration of the specified tutoring time**. This will be worked out between the cooperating teacher and the high school counselor based on where Peer Tutoring fits in the student's schedule
4. Students will report to the counseling office during the first week of class to review peer tutoring requirements and learn of their peer tutoring assignments
5. Once a student is enrolled in a class, he or she is not allowed to drop the class
6. Students are responsible for contacting their Peer Tutoring cooperating teacher and the high school secretary via email if an absence occurs due to illness or another scheduled HS activity (athletic or academic events only). Our high school attendance policies will be followed and attendance will be taken by the cooperating teacher.
7. The student is responsible for reading the website, newsletter and all other sources of obtaining information regarding student life at PHS. In addition, students are required to attend all class meetings.
8. All transportation will be provided by the student. Students may not transport anyone to and from Peer Tutoring. The release below to drive to another location within the district must be completed and on file at the high school.
